GLOBAL LEADERS (AN ANYTOWN RETREAT)

ANYTOWN is a nationally recognized program that empowers youth to create respectful and just communities for all of us, not just some of us. **GLOBAL LEADERS** is a concentrated version of Anytown that gives high school students a chance to dive into engaging exercises and honest dialogue to develop tools of self-awareness, education, conflict resolution, and communication necessary to peacefully resolve prejudice and bigotry.

Imagine a four-day experience where young adults, ages 15-18, escape to the outdoors to break down prejudice, develop friendships with people from around the world, and learn to live and play respectfully with others who come from unique backgrounds and values.

Global Leaders is more than a retreat. Some call it life changing. Why? Because Global Leaders is a fun and safe experience where teens have the chance to reflect on their beliefs, opinions, and actions. Global Leaders strengthens the values participants already have, while allowing them to respectfully listen and communicate with others.

WHO CAN ATTEND GLOBAL LEADERS?

Global Leaders is open both for students in sponsored high schools and to the public (for youth between the ages of 15 and 18).

WHAT DO WE DO AT GLOBAL LEADERS?

The Inclusion Center uses engaging exercises and activities to stimulate meaningful conversation. All day, delegates participate in programming that explores *serious social issues*. Unlike other leadership programs, our Global Leaders program is captivating and relies on youth educating *each other* based on their own experiences and opinions. With fresh air and mountains all around, participants are in a invigorating and fascinating environment for growth and community building.

ACTIVITIES:

- Culture Night – Exploring and sharing your personal heritage
- Engaging Dialogue – Intense, interesting, & gripping
- Wilderness – S'mores, hiking, and campfires
- Leadership Development – Learning to maintain your identity while guiding others to a common goal

GLOBAL LEADERS STAFF

Our staff is comprised of dedicated volunteers that are committed to building communities of peace. Each staff member undergoes an extensive background check and participates in intensive training before attending.

FAQs

WHAT IS THE CAMPSITE LIKE? DO I NEED A TENT?

Camp Tuttle is nestled in Big Cottonwood Canyon, located just outside of Salt Lake City, and surrounded by a deep forest, calm rivers, and unlimited crisp air. The cabins are set up bunk style, complete with mattresses and electricity. There are showers and “regular” restrooms, so don’t worry about getting too “back-to-nature.” Towels, soap, and shampoo are not available, so you’ll notice that they’re on the list of things to bring, along with other toiletry items.

DO I GET MY OWN CABIN?

Uh, no. You will be in a cabin with 7-9 other people of your gender. Respect is a BIG THING at Global Leaders, so we practice living with different people and getting to know different cultures while also honoring the need for privacy among young adults. There will be 2-3 young staff members sleeping in each cabin and one older staff member assigned to the cabin as an advisor.

WHAT DO WE EAT?

At Global Leaders, we have a chef who serves three, nutritious meals daily; and no, it’s not like the “average” cafeteria food. In fact, the meals are one reason our volunteers love coming back so much! Yes, each meal is scrumptious, indeed! We’ll even work with you if you have any dietary restrictions or requirements. Let us know if you are vegan, vegetarian, have any food allergies, or are observing other dietary restrictions.

ARE THERE RULES AT GLOBAL LEADERS?

Here are the rules you should know *before* coming up to Global Leaders:

1. Alcohol, tobacco, or other illegal substances are NOT ALLOWED.
2. Violence or violent behavior is forbidden.
3. No weapons or restricted items (see rule #1).
4. No hookups: romantic or intimate relationships are not allowed. Prior-existing relationships should be handled with discretion.

CAN I LEAVE GLOBAL LEADERS TO GO TO A RELIGIOUS FUNCTION?

No, sorry. We realize that the retreat can fall on important dates for different faith groups and we will make accommodations for you if you need time to pray, worship, or be alone.

SO I CAN’T GO HOME FOR A BIRTHDAY PARTY?

Nope, sorry again. Global Leaders is a lot of fun and we are also busy doing intense activities all day. When someone leaves, they miss too much and come back with their groove thrown off.

DO I NEED TO BRING MONEY?

No! Here is a list of things NOT to bring to Global Leaders:

- Cell Phones
- Valuable Jewelry
- Mp3 Players/iPods
- Food/Candy
- Fragile Items/
Instruments

NO IPODS?

Using music players/cell phones can be exclusive and take away from the experience. There will be a CD player available for entertainment, as well as phones in case of an emergency or need. **More importantly, the Inclusion Center cannot be held responsible for lost or stolen items.**

WHAT IS THE PRICE OF GLOBAL LEADERS?

The cost of Global Leaders is \$300.00, which includes:

- Round-trip transportation from SLC to the campsite
- Programs and materials
- Accidental secondary insurance for participants
- Three catered meals daily, plus snacks
- Lodging, program fees, a t-shirt, and a group photo

NO ONE WILL BE TURNED AWAY BECAUSE THEY CANNOT AFFORD THE FEE.

Scholarships are available to delegates as needed. However, delegates are encouraged to earn as much of the registration fee as possible. Financial difficulties ARE NOT a barrier to attending Global Leaders. Please contact our office for more information.

FAQs CONT'D

WHAT IF I GET SICK?

We will have one assigned staff member who will collect all medications and prescriptions for safekeeping. If you are not feeling well, they will also have extra medications, toiletry items, and other first aid materials. There are at least 2 certified emergency medical technicians at the retreat at all times, in case of an accident. If the need should arise, we will take you to Alta View Hospital at 9660 South 1300 East in Sandy. Remember, we have secondary insurance for you, even if you do not have any.

CAN PEOPLE COME VISIT ME?

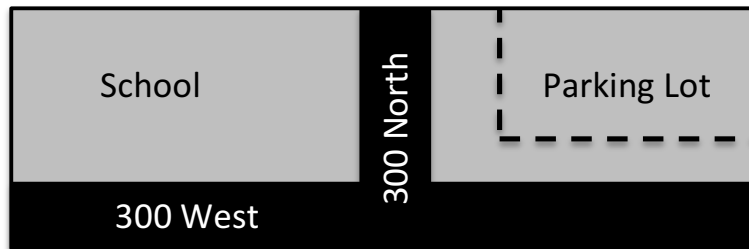
On **Saturday, October 17th**, we will open up Global Leaders to friends and family for Culture Night. Gates open at 7:00 pm. Visitors can get to the campsite by taking I-215 to 6200 South, and following the signs for Big Cottonwood Canyon. We are just up the canyon, above the Solitude Resort and beneath Brighton Resort.

DO I NEED TO PREPARE FOR CULTURE NIGHT?

You can! Talk to your family about what your cultural traditions are; any good stories, or items you can bring to show everyone would be fantastic. However, if this sounds scary or confusing, **don't worry about it**. You will be in a group with people like you and together, you'll figure it out.

GETTING TO GLOBAL LEADERS

Participants will be picked up at West High School on the 15th of October at 2:30 pm. The bus will be departing no later than 3:00 pm. Please meet at the North parking lot at approximately 300 North and 300 West. Drop off will be at 4:30 pm on October 18th.

MAP TO CAMP TUTTLE

- Take I-215 to Exit #6 (6200 South)
- Turn Left off of exit onto South Wasatch Blvd.
- Follow this road to the intersection of Fort Union Blvd., Big Cottonwood Canyon Road, and Wasatch Blvd.
- Turn Left onto Big Cottonwood Canyon Road
- Camp Tuttle will be on the right, just past Solitude Ski Resort. If you reach Brighton Ski Resort, you've gone too far.

YOUTH CONSENT

I agree to be present for the ENTIRE program and agree to have respectful and responsible behavior while there. I understand that CELL PHONES ARE NOT ALLOWED. In case of an emergency, my family may contact the Inclusion Center staff at 801-367-1974 (Cameron's Cell) or 801-652-1918 (hande's Cell) and they will relay the message to me. I understand that no activities are to be engaged in that will endanger other participants or cause damage to the place of training. I understand that I may NOT use Inclusion Center programming or materials outside of the Event. I understand that I may NOT bring any weapons. I understand that I may not bring or use any drugs, alcohol, or cigarettes at the Event. I understand that I will be required to turn in ALL medications to the medical staff to be distributed by them. I understand that I may NOT engage in any sexual activity while at the Event. I understand that I will be required to pay for any damages to the facility for which I am responsible. I understand that, if I fail to follow any of the abovementioned statements, I may be dismissed from the program.
